Another impactful year has come to an end, and once again, we are filled with profound gratitude towards our donors who continue to support us in our journey towards our mission: building a self-reliant Pakistan, one village at a time.

This year marked a period of meaningful growth for Khuddar Pakistan. We added two new villages to our portfolio, bringing the total to four. Our previously adopted villages - Toheedabad (Punjab) and Tibbi Hoot Maher (Punjab) - continue to flourish because of sustained community engagement and donor support. Our newest villages, Bhujbar (Sindh) and Kahrur Pakka (Punjab), are currently in development, and we look forward to raising funds for their full implementation in 2026 with your continued partnership.

We are entering new collaborations with like-minded organizations and individuals who share our unwavering commitment to a more prosperous Pakistan and are willing to work collectively toward that vision.

This year, we have partnered with Zaman Foundation, an organization that operates in several developmental areas but takes special pride in installing water filters and wells in rural communities. Through this partnership, alongside our ongoing collaboration with TAKMIL for schools, Khuddar Pakistan has established a strong foundation for holistic village uplift. We are grateful to Zaman Foundation for helping identify our third village, Bhujbar.

Additionally, two dedicated community members from Raleigh, North Carolina, partnered with us for our fourth village, Kahrur Pakka. They have already been working in the community, and Khuddar Pakistan is excited to collaborate with them on establishing the adult vocational training center in the village.

As our work expands, so do our responsibilities. This year, Khuddar Pakistan issued a call for volunteers, and we are proud to share that many individuals stepped forward to contribute their skills and time. Physicians will support medical awareness initiatives, volunteers with strong communication skills will assist with outreach both locally and within villages, and those with IT expertise will help strengthen our technical capacity. We encourage everyone to consider getting involved—if you can find the time, we can find a role that suits you, and we will provide the necessary training. Lastly, we extend our heartfelt appreciation to our donors whose generosity makes all this possible. Our Mission

Our mission is to see Pakistan become khuddar (self-sufficient), a Pakistan that does not depend on foreign aid, a Pakistan where education, healthcare, clean air, and clean water are accessible to all, and a Pakistan where there are opportunities for all to make a decent living.

Our Values

1. **Education as a Catalyst:** Recognizing education as a key driver of social and economic progress.
2. **Empowerment:** Fostering self-reliance and enabling individuals and communities to take control of their own development. This is central to Khuddar Pakistan's mission.
3. **Sustainability:** Implementing programs and initiatives that create lasting, long-term impact rather than short-term fixes.
4. **Collaboration:** Working in partnership with the Pakistani diaspora, local communities, and other stakeholders to maximize impact.

Our Brief History

Khuddar Pakistan (KPak) was started by a group of professionals in the USA, UK, and Pakistan to transform the success of the Pakistani diaspora into a meaningful impact across Pakistan. Founded in 2020, KPak is led by professionals from diverse backgrounds who work to build stronger communities at home and abroad, with a shared culture of strategic giving and inspiring social change.

Program Highlights/Impact Report

One Community One Village (OCOV)

Imagine a transformed village - children attending school, families with access to clean water, and a community thriving with improved healthcare. This is our goal. Each year, we dedicate our resources to uplifting an additional village in Pakistan, providing essential support in education, water, and healthcare for up to five years, empowering them to build a brighter future for themselves.

First Village: Toheedabad, Punjab

Khuddar Pakistan continues to support Toheedabad by engaging directly with villagers, listening to their needs, and conducting medical awareness sessions for men and women separately, in accordance with cultural norms. The impact to date includes:

- Adopted village in 2022
- Providing education for 90 children
- Installed solar panels and tube well that provide clean water to people, their animals and their fields
- Reinforced Masjid roof to bear the weight of solar panels
- Conducted 3 medical awareness sessions

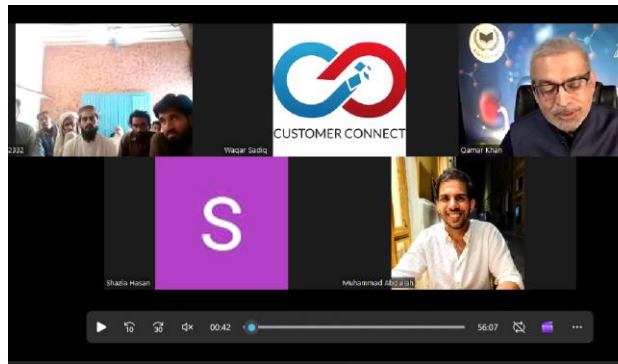
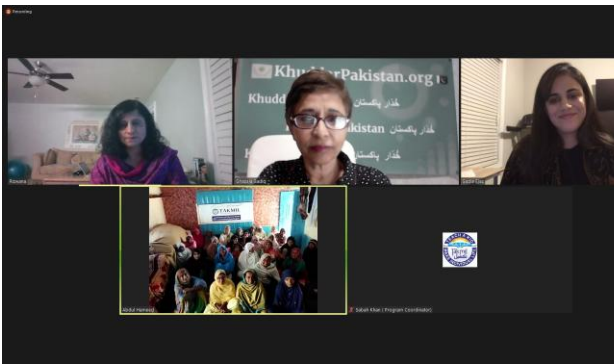

Second Village: Tibi Hoot Maher, Punjab

Khuddar Pakistan continues to support Tibbi Hoot Maher by strengthening relationships with both teachers and community members. A dedicated volunteer has joined the local team as the Village Coordinator for Tibbi Hoot Maher and maintains regular communication with the village to ensure ongoing engagement and support. The impact to date:

- Adopted village in 2024, providing education for 60 children
- Conducted one medical awareness session
- Plans include supplying one to two glucose monitors and training both a male and a female community health volunteer to take glucose readings and communicate the results to a physician in the United States, who will provide medical advice. Plans to provide one or two blood pressure machines with the same goals
- Plans to provide school uniforms is under review

Third Village: Bhujbar, Sindh

This is a new village that Khuddar Pakistan is in the process of sponsoring, in collaboration with the Zaman Foundation (<https://zamanfoundation.pk/>). The Zaman Foundation installed a water filtration system in Bhujbar and subsequently requested that we help establish a school for out-of-school children in the village.

Following joint meetings between the Zaman Foundation, Khuddar Pakistan, and TAKMIL, and a collective “go” decision, TAKMIL launched the school in November 2025, serving 52 children from the community. The school is currently in TAKMIL’s six-month probation period. Upon successful completion, Khuddar Pakistan will sponsor the school for five years and will address additional needs that may arise within the village to support its long-term development.

Fourth Village: Kahrora Pakka, Punjab

This is a new village that Khuddar Pakistan is in the process of sponsoring, in collaboration with two local community members from Raleigh who have been actively working in the village and expressed interest in partnering with us. This village exemplifies the Power of One.

An extraordinary woman, Sobia—who was born into poverty in this village and later earned a master's degree from SZABIST in Karachi—returned home with a vision to uplift her community and empower women. Today, she runs a school serving Grades 1 through 10, educating over 200 children, and operates a sewing vocational center for women.

Khuddar Pakistan's work in this village will mark our first experience supporting a vocational training school, representing an important step forward in our mission to foster sustainable, community-led development.
